

The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically altered the way we live. While many aspects will prove temporary, there can be no doubt that we will find our world has changed in fundamental ways once the threat recedes.

Yet, although economists cannot revise down their 2020 GDP forecasts fast enough to keep pace with developments, not all is doom and gloom. The axiom of opportunity in crisis remains as true as ever. History has repeatedly shown that crises drive innovation. Whether technical, scientific, or developments relating to business models or societal institutions, such innovations all have one feature in common: They solve problems.

We are, for example, seeing how COVID-19 is fast-tracking digital transformation. In response to restrictions imposed to slow the spread of the virus, companies are embracing digitalization at rates far exceeding those achieved by all previous corporate investment and government programs.

While the logic behind digitalization remains the same as in the past, three reasons come to the mind behind this energized uptake:

- Demand is driven by customer needs. When there is no alternative to online services, customers often focus on solutions that maintain some semblance of business normality—and readily adopt them even if they are still evolving.
- Supply capabilities are being pushed, so corporations are laser-focused and acting fast. Side issues are deprioritized, enabling companies to suddenly function far more efficiently as bureaucracy is eliminated.
- Regulatory bodies are creating encouraging framing conditions. Governments are intervening through laws, regulations, and support programs that prioritize crisis response. These are largely accepted by everybody, as the overall benefit to society is placed before individual considerations.

We can be confident that the health issues brought on by COVID-19 will inspire innovations in many fields, including new drugs and medical devices, improved health care processes, and manufacturing and supply chain breakthroughs. And the development of innovations will not only be restricted to these obvious beneficiaries.

Consider the industry in which I have spent my own career: the cement industry and its sales process. The entire sales pattern has taken a U-turn. Every day visits have been replaced by virtual calls. To our surprise, many site conversions have been done by the virtual method instead of direct visits. Various kinds of documents and agreements have been replaced with e-papers and documents. During this pandemic, my organization came up with 1 solution mobile application where from orders punching to delivery receiving confirmation is being done. Bye-Bye to any kind of documents and I hope this app has helped to streamline the business in a wonderful way and every stakeholder has accepted it with both hands.

The coronavirus may be the current accelerant, but it is also important to reflect on what the next driver may be, what new regulations might come out of it, and how the resulting innovations will likely become important for your business. The world continues to grow and develop. In short, we can say – for Innovation, this pandemic has been nothing less than "Blessing in disguise." And importantly these recent innovations will help mankind and create a way forward for future innovations as well!!!

- •Online Courses have developed and sites like Byjus, Whitehat jr which have been part of the new curriculum and teaching aids.
- ·Certifications have come up using online platforms which are helping students increase awareness.

INNOVATION- SINGLE GOOD THING CAUSED BY COVID-19

In addition to the immeasurable suffering and loss of life, the deadly coronavirus is already impacting the world economy, hurting stocks, halting travel and meetings, impacting the daily ritual of going to the office, and quarantining millions. Businesses worldwide are feeling the effect of these changes in behavior and economists are predicting the virus will result in an economic loss to the tune of hundreds of billions of dollars. But while the grave and tragic human toll of lost-lives cannot be measured, there is a silver lining. If the history of pandemics is a guide, this contagion, like all others, will spark a wave of innovation, proportional to how it alters the shape of society.

Just about every major scourge has similarly affected humanity and business, and there is no reason to believe that the coronavirus will impact us differently. The earliest known pandemic in history was the Plague of Athens in 429 BC that took almost 100,000 lives and changed how people think about life and disease. Since then, there have been hundreds of epidemics where each one has cost society anywhere from several thousand to tens of millions of lost lives.

While each pandemic is unique and the world has evolved considerably over the past 2500 years, they share some commonalities in how society copes, behaves, thinks and innovates. As extreme and cruel as these diseases have been to society, each one has altered how we live and function, leading to innovation that facilitates the changes we have made to our lives.

Very few disasters have affected society so significantly and done greater damage to humanity than the Great Plague or the Black Death between 1331–3153 in Europe. No one knows how many people died, but all estimates range from tens of millions to hundreds of millions. The Black Death is estimated to have killed 30% to 60% of Europe's population and is considered the greatest calamity in history. Just about everything changed as a result of this plague. With millions of people dead, human labor became a premium. People needed to work, and they needed to work harder and longer, giving rise to today's work style. Wages rose and the poor became wealthier, equalizing society. Land was plentiful as there were fewer people to share it with, and as incomes rose, so did literacy, giving rise to new thinking and freedom of thought. With education, the hierarchical society people lived in before the plague began to give way to a society further grounded in parity.

Pandemics catalyze innovation and accelerate change by providing an environment for launching and testing new ideas. Today's coronavirus is already changing cultural and business norms shaking to the core of what we have taken for granted for decades and centuries. The simple act of a handshake is increasingly becoming a relic, even as we surgically wash our hands a dozen times a day.
